- 4.1 Executive Director Update

- a. Campaigns & Action

4.4 Executive Updates

- a. Operations
 - 4.4.a.1 A group has been working on the Paw Pass, Joe Beveerz has recently joined the Paw Pass program. Working with Anmol on barriers that international students face, such as living between 1st and 14th street and paying for prescriptions out of pocket (not sure if they know there is the option of direct billing), potential to add another preferred pharmacy that is right by Superstore and offers free delivery, so that it is closer for international students in the east end of Brandon. Request by Brittany for Medicine Shop Pharmacy to be added as a preferred pharmacy by Student VIP. Direct billing can be done at any pharmacy. Delivery option should be promoted to students as a more convenient option. Need more preferred providers, need to advertise more that they can do delivery: meet with Ginnut about this to get her opinion.
- **b.** Engagement
 - 4.4.b.1 The committee is planning B-Queer bingo for February 11th at BU in Bailey's Area. Wellness Spirit Week is coming up (in conjunction with ACC's Fill Your Cup) as well, which will have the Wellness Fair on January 26th. ACC is sending prizes to Winnipeg and Parkland; Alyshia knows more about this. Winnipeg, Parkland, and Portage campuses are encouraged to participate in the wellness activities.

6.0 Open Forum

6.1 One of Brittany's friends is moving back to their country, Brittany suggested they donate their extra clothes to international students. Idea to do a clothing drive, similar to dress for success as it will be similar to business attire. Can benefit students in programs that would need it. Go in partnership with the Friendship Centre for this, as they do a dress for success program; concerns with this as the



Friendship Centre is for Indigenous peoples. Brittany will look into it more. Len has suggested if Westman Immigrant Services does any kind of coat drive and maybe we could partner with WIS instead. We can post a photo of the clothing on social media and connect it with students who are in need (Karleigh/Len's idea) - Dee wants to do the clothing drive for the end of the year, when students will be interviewing and going into the business world.

- Anmol mentioned International students were unable to get their medical cards. This morning they were enrolled in the plan and were able to get their medical plan cards. Mistake was by the college. Make social media post about international medical plan cards being available (Student VIP).
- 6.3 Dee would like recognition for Karleigh for being at the SA for 6 years, Karleigh would like a gold name plate for her desk. Julia mentioned a \$500 gift card could be a good idea.

MOTION: Be it resolved that the ACCSA allocate \$500 plus the plaque money from the staff appreciation budget for Karleigh Paul's six-year anniversary at the ACCSA. Motioned by Ali seconded by Ali. Motion **carried**.

6.4 The college hosts administrative justice training, Karleigh and Alyshia both need to take it and the college offered to pay for one of them. It is a course designed to be able to properly advocate for students. Karleigh and Alyshia both need to take this course to continue to be advocates. Course costs \$1,131; amount will come from professional development budget line. Alyshia will take the course automatically, Karleigh brought this to council to take the amount out of the professional development budget line in order to take the course. This will be the only training done this year. Blake mentioned it would be more beneficial students for Karleigh to take this course/training as there would be a backup advocate for students in the event that Alyshia gets overloaded with advocacy cases. The course is from January 19 – 20.

MOTION: Be it resolved that the ACCSA approves the budget of \$1131 to provide Karleigh Paul with training for advocacy (Principles of Administrative Justice course) motioned by Blake seconded by Len. Motion **Carried.**
