


Organizational Changes

- In March 2021, students changed the ACCSA Executive Committee Structure to take affect for the next year
 - President
 - Vice President Finance → Vice President Governance
 - Vice President Events & Marketing → Vice President Engagement
 - Vice President Diversity & Inclusion *NEW POSITION*
- With this change, the ACCSA became more focused on issues important to students, such as social justice issues, provincial lobbying, and full cycle accountability within the organization




Initiatives – Student Spaces

- Student's voted in favour of a full renovation project for the ACCSA
 Offices and Students Spaces at the Vic Ave Campus (Crossroads)
- This \$400-\$500k project is currently entering the final design stages, and construction should begin in May 2022







Initiatives – Improved Communications

- The ACCSA started a new Student Focus Blog to be the voice for students all times of the year.
- A new investment in email communications provided the ability to track communications to better improve ACCSA communications to students.
- Increased focus on social media use has provided us additional ways to get in touch with students!

Initiatives – Wellness

- The ACCSA further invested in students health and wellness by ensuring the I.M. Well app was updated for easier use
- Student's can access Masters Level Counsellors 24/7, and always have access to great articles and resources on a variety of wellness topics.



Financial Summary

- The ACCSA membership voted to marginally increase ACCSA Fees in March 2021. This was the first increase in over 8 years.
- Notable Budget items include:
 - Additional \$1750 for a Student Housing Program
 - Roughly \$8000 reduction from previous year in Office Supplies
 - A balanced budget compared to previous years \$8,100 deficit
 - New \$1000 spending lines for satellite campuses for activities
- Total assets, reserves, and capital items valued at \$928,731
- Healthy Financial Reserves \$261,860 for Capital Reserves, \$286,342 for Health Plan, & \$275,407 in unrestricted reserve funds
- Full Budget and Audited Statements available on website.
